Holland Hall Extra Curricular Programs

Inspired by the Jesuit value of educating the whole person, St. Bonaventure's College offers dynamic extracurricular programs that foster leadership, extends the classroom experience and builds community. Skills and experiences that may not be gained through the prescribed provincial curriculum – such as time management, social and life skills and cooperation – are addressed in these programs to help students strike an important balance between their academic and social lives. Additionally, students have the opportunity to try something new or explore and expand their interests and talents. These programs are offered in a nurturing environment where friendships flourish.

Clubs are subject to student participation and new clubs are formed based on student interest. Each year there are opportunities for teachers as well as students to propose new extracurricular club ideas. In addition, parents are always welcome and encouraged to share their talents and knowledge by volunteering to run or help out with different extracurricular initiatives.

K-6 Programs

Our K-6 teachers offer a variety of extra-curricular programs which run Monday through Thursday. This year we will have two sessions. Session one will take place October 21 until November 29, 2019 and session two will take place February 3 until March 6, 2020.

We have attempted to offer programming which encompasses all grades for each term. The following programs will be offered this year:

- **STEAM (Session 1&2: Grades K and 1)** – Students imagine and create through play, ingenuity and innovation using science, technology, engineering, art, and math.
- **Yoga (Session 1: Grade 2; Session 2: Grade 3)** – Yoga techniques promote self-health, relaxation and inner fulfillment so children can navigate life's challenges with a little more ease. Yoga at a young age encourages self-esteem and body awareness with a physical activity that is non-competitive. It enhances children's flexibility, strength and coordination. A nutritious snack will be provided at the start of each class. (Note: Students are expected to bring their own yoga mats and keep them in their lockers.)
- **Art Club (Session 1: Grade 3 and 5; Session 2: Grade 4 and 6)** – An art program that includes a variety of art activities as well as seasonal crafts which spark imagination and creativity.
- **Homework Haven (Grades 4-6)** – Under teacher supervision, Junior and Senior high students help elementary students with their daily homework and studies.
